**Deadline: March 20**

Please adhere to the following guidelines when creating your poster:

- **Layout:** Please use the [ct.qmat template](#) and [logo](#).
- **Acceptable poster size:** A0, portrait format
- **File type:** PDF, 5MB at most
- **File name:** AffiliatedInstitution\_LastNamePresenter\_Poster.pdf (e.g., "JMU\_Curie\_Poster.pdf")
- **Submission** via email to [ct.qmat@uni-wuerzburg.de](mailto:ct.qmat@uni-wuerzburg.de)

# Guidelines for the Poster Teaser Session

**2 slides, 1 minute | Deadline: March 20**

During the poster teaser session, each presenter will have the opportunity to capture the audience's interest, introduce themselves and their projects, and spark a dialogue with a one-minute pitch using at most two slides.

Be creative! You will not be able to summarize your poster in one minute. And the time limit is meant to be literal:  $\leq 60$  seconds! It is better to concentrate on succinctly conveying why others might be interested in learning more about your work (and not on speaking faster 😊).

Please submit a PDF file with two slides at the maximum:

- **Slide one:** The first slide should contain the title of the poster, your name and affiliation (including the Cluster logo/logo of the institute), additional logos, an illustration, a cartoon...
- **Slide two:** The second slide should address three main points of your poster. (It should *not* a summary of your work!)

All poster teaser slides will be displayed by the event organizers from one file. Thus, it's vital that we collect all slides by March 20.

## Requirements:

- **File types:** PDF, 2MB at most
